

The Problem: No One-Stop Shopping

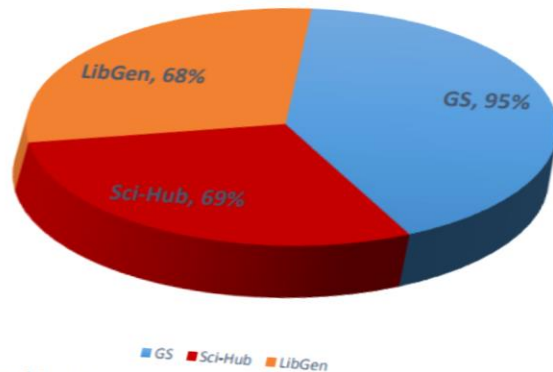


Figure 1. Overall Retrieval Rates for GS, Sci-Hub and LibGen samples in April 2017.

As it can be seen from Figure 1, the overall retrieval rates for the 2,750 samples, as of April 2017, are pretty good. The discovery rate for Google Scholar is reaching a 95% ratio and the full-text retrieval rates for both Sci-Hub and LibGen are respectively 69% and 68%. This is not what one would have probably expected considering the breadth of the disciplines covered in this study. The majority of samples discovered in GS were done by article title (99.6%) and a very small proportion by DOI (0.4%). On the other hand, Sci-Hub and LibGen samples were mainly retrieved by article title (88% and 89% respectively) with a higher proportion than GS through DOI (12% for Sci-Hub and 11% for LibGen). Some samples were retrieved by the PubMed Central reference number (PMCID) in both Sci-Hub (0.4%) and LibGen (0.1%).

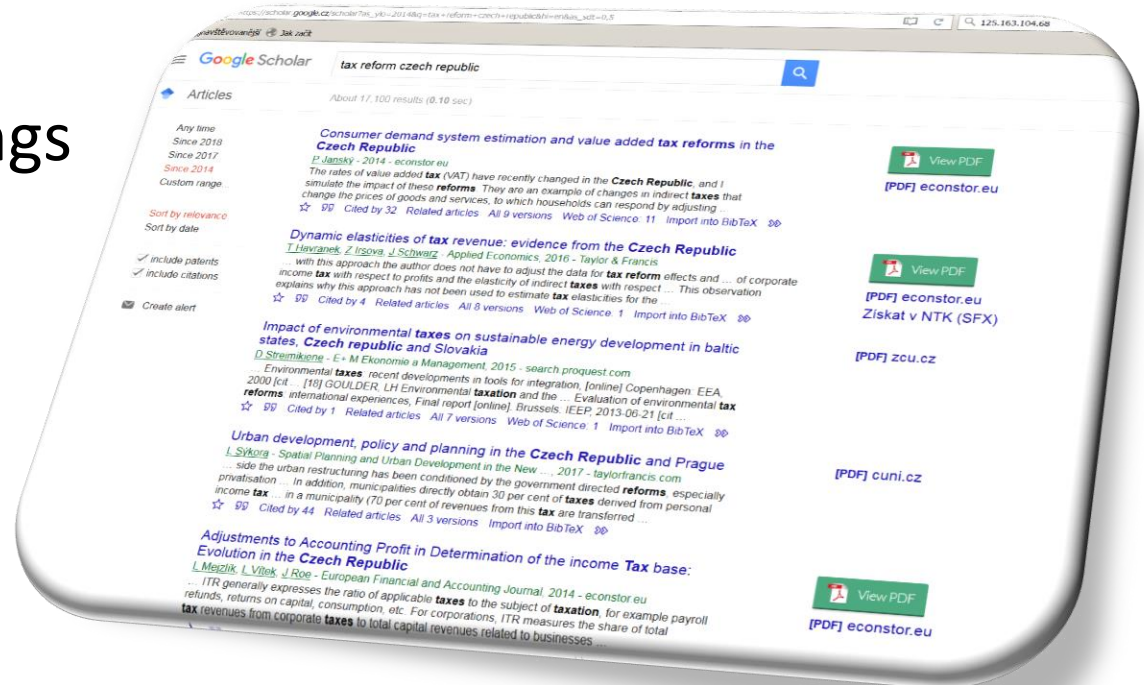

Definition: h-index

h =largest integer for which the following is true:

- At least h papers of the given researcher have been cited at least h time (each)

Impact Factor

Measure of the impact of a certain journal, based on citations to papers published in that journal:

$$IF(J, Y) = \frac{c(J, Y)}{p(J, Y)}$$

$IF(J, Y)$... impact factor of journal J in year Y

$p(J, Y)$... number of papers published in J in years $Y - 1$ and $Y - 2$

$c(J, Y)$... cites in year Y to papers published in J in $Y - 1$ and $Y - 2$

Impact Factors can be found in Journal Citation Reports (JCR).

Other Measures

5-year impact factor, immediacy index, cited half-life, citing half-life, eigenfactor score, article influence score, ...

Not Easy: Publishing Decisionmaking

*“My take on this is that more and more it is the quality of the individual article that matters, not necessarily the quality of the journal. **Good papers get published in predatory journals and poor quality papers get published in reputable, high-impact journals due to the well-known issues that can occur with peer review.** Journal quality and reputation was very important in the days of purely paper journals when it was a guiding factor in deciding what to include in a library’s collection. But the lines are very much blurred now that articles are available online open-access.*

***Critical appraisal skills**, to assess the quality of individual articles, are more and more essential.”*

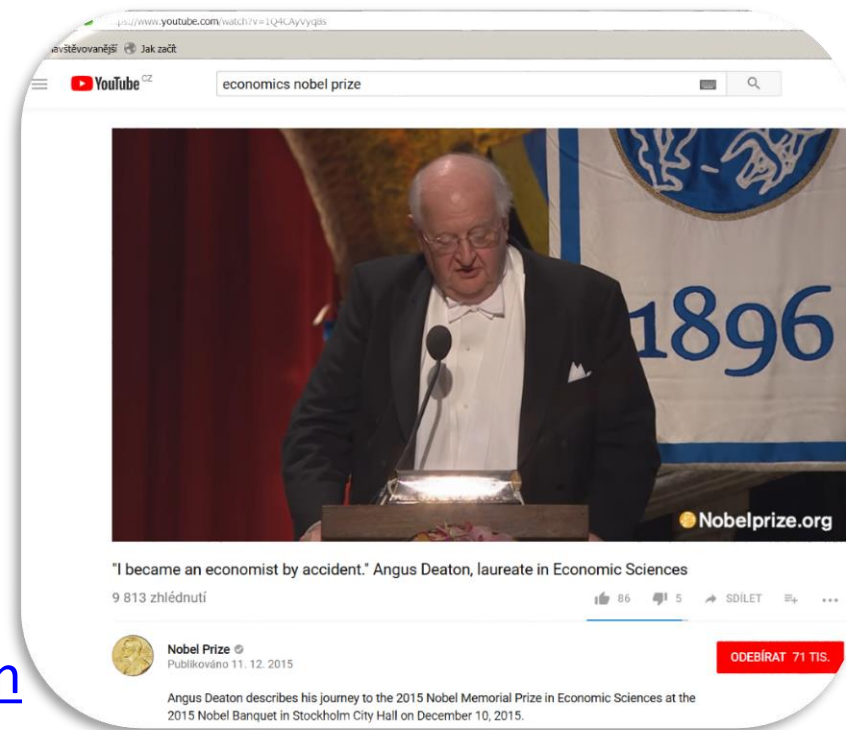
